Installation

- 1. Read and observe the instructions Please read all safety and operating instructions before using this set-top-box. Adhere to all instructions.
- 2. Retain the instructions Keep the safety and operating instructions for future use.
- Heed the warnings Observe all warnings on the set-top-box and in the operating instructions
- Power supply This set-top-box is powered from a DC power supply plug. To prevent
 a risk of electric shock, please make sure to connect the power supply to your power
 outlet correctlu.
- 5. Sources of energy To power this set-top-box, you may only use sources whose specifications meet the nameplate ratings on the set-top-box rear panel. If in doubt about the type of energy source at home or in your office, please contact your set-top-box dealer or an electrician. For set-to-boxes designed for battery operation or powering from other energy sources, please refer to the operating instructions.
- 6. Overloading Do not overload the power outlets and extension cords to avoid risk of fire or electric shock. Overloaded power outlets and extension cords, frayed power cords, damaged or cracked conductor insulations and damaged plugs are dangerous and may lead to electric shock or fire. Inspect the cord on regular basis and if it appears that insulation damage or property deterioration may have occurred, ask a qualified service technician for a replacement.
- 7. Power cord protection Route the power cords so they are not likely to be stepped on or damaged by placing objects on or against them, while paying extra attention to the points of their exit from the set-top-box.

- 9. Accessories To avoid any danger, do not use any accessories other than those recommended by this set-top-box manufacturer.

Attention: Ensure safety when using electric energy. Any equipment or accessories powered from the grid and connected to this unit must be marked with a certification label on the equipment itself and must not be modified to avoid locking the safety features. This will minimize potential risk of electric shock or fire. In case of any doubt, please contact a qualified service technician.
- 11. Accessories Do not put this set-top-box on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, console or table. Otherwise, your set-top-box might fall on the floor, resulting in a serious injury to children, adults or a serious damage to itself. Use this set-top-box only with a cart, base, stand, console or table recommended by the manufacturer or supplied with the set-top-box. Any mounting of the unit must be carried out according to the manufacturer's instructions and the mounting accessories recommended by the manufacturer should be used.
- 11a. Take care while moving the cart with the set-top-box. Sudden stops, applying excessive force and uneven surfaces may lead to the set-top-box damage.
- 12. Outdoor aerial grounding If an outdoor aerial or cable system is connected to this set-top-box, it's necessary that this aerial or cable system should be earthed to provide a certain protection against voltage surges and static charge formation. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1984 (Section No. 54 of the Canadian Electrical Code, Part 1) provides instructions on proper grounding of the pole and the supporting framework, grounding the connecting lead to the aerial's discharge unit, connecting to the grounding electrodes and grounding electrode requirements.
- 13. Using

- 14. Cleaning Prior to cleaning, please disconnect this set-to-box from your power outlet. Do not use liquid cleaning agents or cleaning agents in sprays. Use a dampened cloth for cleaning.
- 15. Objects which could get in touch with dangerous voltage points or "short-circuit" the parts may cause fire or electric shock. Avoid spilling any liquid on the set-top-box.
- 16. Lightning thunderstorms For increased protection of this set-top-box during a lightning thunderstorm or for longer periods when the device will not be used, disconnect the power cord from the power socket and disconnect the antenna or cable system. 
Repairs

- 17. Repairs No not attempt to repair this set-top-box by yourself as opening the cabinet and removing the covers may expose you to a dangerous voltage or other risk. Have all repairs performed by qualified service technicians.
- 18. Damage requiring a repair In the following situations, disconnect your set-top-box from the power outlet and have it repaired by qualified service technicians:
 - A. The power supply or power connecting lead has been damaged.
 - B. Liquid or foreign objects have fallen into the set-top-box.
 - C. The set-top-box has been exposed to rain or water.
 - D. The picture does not appear correctly even if the operating instructions are observed.
 - Only use the controls described in these user's manual. Incorrect settings of other controls may lead to damage, while restoring normal operating condition of the set-top-box involves a great deal of work of a qualified service technician.
 - E. The set-top-box has fallen on the ground or its cabinet has been damaged.
 - F. The set-top-box shows a apparent change in its operating behaviour which clearly indicates a need to make a repair.
- 19. Spare parts If any spare parts are required, ask your service technician to verify if the used spare parts have the same safety specifications as the original ones. Using the spare parts as specified by the set-top-box manufacturer will protect your from the risk of fire, electric shock or other danger.







System connection

General information

There many various types of TV sets and other devices that can be connected to this STB. This manual describes the most common methods of connecting your equipment.

Connecting to a TV set





Note: Please connect the HDMI cable to the receiver ONLY when turned off (red Standby indicator lights)

Getting Started

Welcome

When using this STB for the first time, "Welcome" menu will appear. Press the cursor keys to set Region, Language, Display Mode and Aspect Mode. Highlight "OK" and press "OK" to start searching the channels.



Installation

The Installation menu allows you to set channel searching and LCN Installation option.

- 1. Press the "MENU" button to show the main menu.
- 2. Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight "Installation" and press "RIGHT" to open the "Installation" menu.
- 3. Press the "UP" or DOWN" cursor button to highlight the desired item, then press "OK" to open the nested menu.
- 4. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



Auto Scan (Automatic search)

The "Auto Search" menu allows you to set automatic channel searching.

- Select "Auto Scan" and press "OK" to open the "Auto Scan" menu.
- 2. Press the cursor buttons to set "FTA Only" (non-encoded only) and "T2 Signal Only".
- 3. Highlight the "Search" item and press "OK" to start the automatic scan.

Channel Scan

The "Channel scan" menu allows you to set manual channel searching.

- 1. Select "Channel Scan" and press "OK" to open the Channel Scan menu.
- 2. Press the cursor buttons to set Scan Mode, Scan Band, Channel No. Frequency, Bandwidth, then highlight "Search" and press "OK" to start the channel searching.



LCN (Logical channel numbering)

If the LCN (Logical channel numbering) feature is enabled, you cannot change the original TV channel numbers created by searching.

To enable/disable the LCN feature, set the "LCN" to on/off.

Operation

Changing channels

There are three channel selection methods available - step-by-step browsing the channel list, selecting by number and selecting from the screen channel list.

- 1. Step-by-step browsing the channel list:
 - To move in the channel list, press the arrow up or down button on the remote control.
- 2. Selecting by a number:
 - Enter the channel number directly using the numeric buttons, then press OK to select the desired channel.
- 3. Selecting from the screen channel list:
 - You can also select the desired channel number directly in the screen channel list. To display this list, press OK. For more details, please refer to "Editing channels" section in this manual.

Opening the Electronic programming guide (EPG)

To open the EPG for all channels:

- 1. Press "EPG" to open the EPG (Electronic programming guide) menu.
- 2. Press the cursor buttons to switch between the channel list and current/next events.
- Press the GREEN button to set the event timer.
- 4. Press the RED button to display the "Time Bar" menu.
- 5. Press "OK" to display selected event information.
- 6. Press the "EXIT" button to return to the previous menu.

In the "Time bar" menu:

- To exit the time bar.
- Back to the current time.
- ◆ Skip forward or backward in time in 30-minute steps.
- **Skip forward or backward in time 2-hour steps.**
- Skip forward or backward in time 24-hour steps.








Editing channels

Edit Channel menu

- 1. Press the "MENU" button to show the main menu.
- 2. Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight "Edit Channel" and press "RIGHT" to open the "Edit Channel" menu.
- 3. Press the "UP" or DOWN" cursor button to highlight the desired item, then press "OK" to open the nested menu.
- 4. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



TV Channel List

- In the Edit Channel menu, select "TV Channel List" and press "OK" to open the TV Channel List menu.
- 2. Press the "UP and "DOWN" button to highlight the channel and then press OK to preview the desired TV channel.



Use this menu to set the favourites and to lock, skip, sort, delete or rename channels.

- Press the "FAV" button and then press "OK" to edit the FAV (Favorite) feature.
- Press the "RED" button to enable the "Lock" function. You will be prompted to enter
 a password (default password is "0000"); then press "OK" to lock the selected
 channels.
- Press the "GREEN" button to enable the "Skip" feature, then press "OK" to skip the selected channel.
- Press the "YELLOW" button to enable the "Move" feature, highlight the desired channel and press OK to confirm. Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select a new position, then press "OK". This will move the channel to a new position.

- Press the "BLUE" button to open the nested Edit channel menu.
- Press "OK" again to cancel the relevant function.
- Press the "colour" button again to exit the relevant function.
- 3. Press "Exit" to save and return to the "Edit Channel" menu.

Radio Channel List

- In the Edit Channel menu, select "Radio Channel List" and press "OK" to open the Radio Channel List menu.
- 2. Press the "UP and "DOWN" button to highlight the channel and then press OK to listen to the desired radio channel.

Note:

Controlling in the "Radio Channel List" mode is basically the same as in the "TV Channel List" mode except for one thing: As no image information is available In the "Radio Channel List" mode, logo is always displayed on the right of the preview window.

Delete All

- In the Edit Channel menu, select "Delete All" and press" OK".
 You will be prompted to enter password (default password is "0000").
- A warning message window will appear.
 Select "Yes" and press "OK" to delete all channels.
 To cancel the deletion, select No and press OK.



System Settings

System Setup menu

The System Setup alows you to set Language, TV System, Local Time Setting, Timer Setting, Parental Lock, OSD Setting, Favorite, Audio Description Setting and Other.


- 1. Press the "MENU" button to show the main menu.
- 2. Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight "System Setup" and press "RIGHT" to open the System Setup" menu.

- 3. Press the "UP" or DOWN" cursor button to highlight the desired item, then press "OK" to open the nested menu.
- 4. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



Language

This menu allows you to set the language of system, audio, subtitles and teletext and enable the subtitle function.



Subtitles: Off/Normal/Hard of Hearing

TV System

This menu allows you to set Video Resolution, Aspect Mode and Digital Audio Out.

Video Resolution: Setting various video signal resolutions Aspect Mode: 16:9 Full / 4:3PS / 4:3LB / 16:9PS

Digital Audio Out: LPCM Out (LPCM output) / BS Out (BS output)

Local Time Setting

This menu allows you to make region and time settings. Region: This menu is used to change the region settings. GMT Usage: This menu is used the set the GMT Usage.

The following options are available: By Region / User Define / Off

GMT Offset: This menu is only active if "User Define" value has been set in the GMT

Usage menu.

The GMT Offset range is "-11:30 ~ +12:00" in 30-minute increments.

Summer Time The following options are available:On/Off

Date: "Date" and "Time" menus are only active if the GMT Usage is set to "Off".

Time: Press the numeric buttons to set time.

Timer Setting

This menu enables you to set the program timers. You can set up to 8 timers.

Timer Mode: Off / Once / Daily / Weekly / Monthly

Timer Service: Channel / Record

Wakeup Channel: Allows you to set the channel to be tuned during the wakeup.

Wakeup Date: Press the numeric buttons to set the wakeup date. **On Time:** Press the numeric buttons to set the wakeup time. **Duration:** Press the numeric buttons to set the wakeup duration.

Parental Lock

This menu allows you to protect the menu a channels or to change your password.

- 1. In the "System Setup" menu, select "Parental Lock" and press "OK" you will be asked to enter a password (default password is "0000").
- 2. When the correct password has been set using the numeric buttons, the child lock menu appears.

Menu Lock: To lock the Edit channel / Installation menu. To open these menus, you must enter a password.

The menu lock can be turned on/off.

Rating Lock: Off / AGE4 / AGE5 / AGE6 / AGE7 / AGE8 / AGE9 / AGE10 / AGE11 /

AGE12 / AGE13 / AGE14 / AGE15 / AGE16 / AGE17 / AGE18

New Password: To change the password. Confirm password: To confirm new password.

OSD Setting

This menu allows you to set the display duration and transparency of your OSD menu. OSD Timeout: 1-10 seconds.

OSD Transparency: To set the OSD menu transparency to Off / 10% / 20% / 30% / 40%.

Favorite

This menu allows you to rename the favorite group.

- In the System setup menu, select "Favorite" and press OK to open the Favorite menu.
- Select the desired group and press "OK" to open the virtual keyboard. Press the
 cursor buttons to enter letters and numbers, then press OK to confirm. When the
 entering is finished, press the BLUE button to confirm. The Favorite group name has
 been changed successfully.
- 3. Press the "EXIT" button to exit the group rename menu.



Audio Description Setting

This menu allows you to set Use AD as default and AD Volume Offset: This is only applicable to programs for which the sound description is broadcast by a TV station

Use AD as default: On/Off AD Volume Offset: -3 ~ 3

Other

This menu allows you to set Antenna Power, Channel Plau Type, Auto Standbu

Antenna Power (Power supply to the antenna): On/Off When the "Antenna Power" is set to "On", STB will provide 5V power supply to the antenna.

When set to "Off", this power supply will not he available. Channel Play Type: All / Free / Scrambled

Auto Standby (Automatically switch to stand-by mode): 30Min /

1 Hour / 2 Hour / 3 Hour / Off

If no command is entered on the STB front panel or the remote control for 30 minutes - 3 hours and no timer event occurs, the STB will automatically switch to standby.

When Off is selected, the STB will not automatically switch to standby.

Tools

Tools main menu

- 1. Press the "MENU" button to show the main menu.
- 2. Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight "Tools" and press "RIGHT" to open the "Tools" menu.
- 3. Press the "UP" or DOWN" cursor button to highlight the desired item, then press "OK" to open the nested menu.
- 4. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



Information

This menu allows you to display some parameters of this STB.

- 1. In the "Tools" menu, select "Information" and press "OK" to open the information window.
- Press the "EXIT" button to exit.

Factory Setting

This menu allows you to restore the factory settings of this STB, deleting all existing channels.

- In the "Tools" menu, select the "Factory Setting" and press OK.
 You will be prompted to enter password (default password is "0000").
- A confirmation window will pop up.
 To restore the factory settings and delete all channels, press "Yes".
 To cancel the factory settings restoration, select "No".
- 3 Press the "EXIT" button to exit

Software Upgrade

This unit offers features for the user to update the software version - either wirelessly (OTA) or using a USB flash drive.

- 1. Open the "Tools" menu, select "S/W Upgrade by OTA" or "Upgrade by USB" and press "OK" Software Upgrade menu appears.
- 2. Press the cursor buttons to select a desired option and then highlight "Start" and press OK to start the upgrade.
- 3. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



Remove USB device safely

In the "Tools" menu, select "Remove USB device safely". Press OK to confirm. A window will pop up. Press "OK" again.




Multimedia player

Multimedia player main menu

Make sure that external data storage device is connected to the USB port.

- Press the "MENU" button to show the main menu.
- 2. Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight "Media Player" and press the "RIGHT" button to open the multimedia player menu.
- 3. Press the "UP" or DOWN" cursor button to highlight the desired item, then press "OK" to open the nested menu.
- 4. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



Media Playback

This feature allows you to play back files from the USB port.

- In the "Media player" menu, press "1" to select "Record", "Video", "Music" or "Image" option.
- 2. Press "OK" to open Media Plauback menu.
- 3. Press "UP" and "DOWN" cursor buttons to select a desired multimedia file and press "OK to start playback.
- 4 Press the "FXIT" button to exit



Record:

RED button: Press the RED button to open the rename window.

GREEN button: Move the highlight over a program to be locked. Press the GREEN button - you will be asked to enter a password. The default password is "0000". Once the correct password is set, the program is locked. To unlock the program, press the GREEN button again.

"YELLOW" button: Press the "YELLOW" button to delete a recorded file.

"1" button: Press to switch among Music /Image /Video /Record tabs.

EXIT (End) button: Return to the parent directory.

Video:

BLUE button: Press the "BLUE" button to open the nested Edit channel menu.

"1" button: Press to switch among Music /Image /Video /Record tabs.

"2" button: Press the button "2" to open the sorting. You can sort by Name / Time / Size.

EXIT (End) button: Return to the parent directory.

An external subtitle file's name must match the video file name. National alphabets use

Unicode coding. Press the BLUE button for further selections.

To enable the video embedded subtitles, press SUBTITLE button.

Music:

"RED" button: Press the "RED" button to display and edit the playlist.

GREEN button: Move the highlight over the file to be added in the playlist, then press the GREEN button to add. Favorite icon will appear on the file. Press again to cancel the favorite and delete the file from the plaulist.

YELLOW button: Press YELLOW button to add all files in the current directory in the playlist. Press this button again to delete all files in the current directory from the playlist. BLUE button: Press the "BLUE" button to open the nested Edit channel menu.

"1" button: Press to switch among Music /Image /Video /Record tabs.

"2" button: Press the button "2" to open the sorting window.

You can sort by Name / Time / Size / Favorite.

"INFO" (Information) button: Press the "INFO" button to select a playback mode.

You can select from Repeat Folder / Random Folder / Repeat One.

EXIT (End) button: Return to the upper directoru.

Image:

"RED" button: Press the "RED" button to display and edit the playlist.

GREEN button: Move the highlight over the file to be added in the playlist, then press the GREEN button to add. Favorite icon will appear on the file.

YELLOW button: Press YELLOW button to add all files in the current directory in the playlist. Press this button again to delete all files in the current directory from the playlist. BLUE button: Press the "BLUE" button to open the nested Edit channel menu.

"1" button: Press to switch among Music /Image /Video /Record tabs.

"2" button: Press the button "2" to open the sorting window.

You can sort bu Name / Time / Size / Favorite.

"INFO" (Information) button: Press "INFO" to open the image settings.

"3" button: Press "3" to display images in the multiple display mode

EXIT (End) button: Return to the parent directory.

HDD Information

This menu allows you to display some parameters of the exchangeable disc.

- In the Media Player menu, select "HDD Information" and press "OK" to open the USB disc information window.
- 2. Press the "EXIT" button to exit.



Press the YELLOW button to open the Format menu.

• Format FAT/NTFS

Press "LEFT" or "RIGHT" cursor buttons to change the Disk Mode settings. Press OK to format. Press "Cancel" to cancel the settings.

ATTENTION: The formatting will DEFINITELY erase the entire disc contents! Be cautious.

DVR Set REC&TMS/Record/Timeshift
 Press the BLUE button to open the DVR Set menu (DVR settings).
 Press "LEFT" or "RIGHT" cursor buttons to change the DVR type settings.
 Press "OK" to confirm. Press "Cancel" to cancel the settings.





DVR Settings
